Date of project: Terms 3 and 4

A history led project which will begin by broadening our understanding of chronology and where the Ancient Egyptians fit in a wider timeline of historical eras. Children will learn about what life was like in Ancient Egypt, locate Egypt on maps and identify human and physical features including learning about rivers in geography.

All of the learning produced through various mini-outcomes will be presented at a Museum exhibition where the children will act as tour guides and lead visitors around the various exhibits.

Maths – Fractions and decimals; geometry, area and perimeter.

Science – Animals including humans – digestive system and teeth and States of Matter.

History – Ancient Egypt

Geography – Egypt and human and physical features including rivers, pyramids, sphinx.

Art – Sculpture (Egyptian masks) Collage – Mosaic.

DT – Shell structures (Making a sarcophagus – nets and 3D shapes)
