Maths this week we started to use symbols < > = and use the language more, greater and less than to compare numbers. The children were looking at the tens in numbers to decide which was more or less. Some children liked to remember which way the symbol went to imagine Wilbur the cat eating the greater number. It would be great to practise at home asking which number is more or less or equal.

We have been practising a song to share with you for the Harvest celebrations we hope you like it, it will be shared with you next week on Google Classroom.
