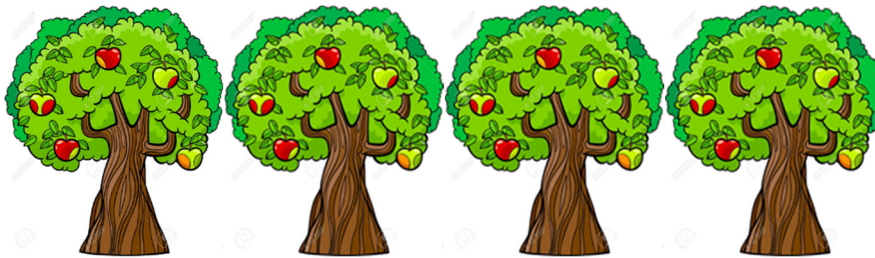
Emerald Class Newsletter:

We have started writing our amazing Peter Pan stories. The children are loving this despite the fact it is challenging to apply all the things we have learnt with our grammar and spellings. This does not deter them and a lot of the children were desperate to continue their story all day.

In Maths, we have started our multiplication and the children were confident that multiplication meant groups of numbers, such as:



$$4 \times 5 = 20$$

The children needed to find the question from the picture and then calculate the answer. We practised many different ways of understanding the concept of multiplication and the children are already very confident. Well done Emerald Class!

Within our other projects, we have been learning to program beebots and probots. We have looked at directional language as well as calculating turns.

We are aiming to program an algorithm which will help us navigate Neverland. The children have been creating their own Neverland maps which includes different physical features.

In art, we have been learning how to collage to create a silohetted landscape of London in 1666, with the Great Fire of London burning behind. The have also applied their blending skills for the smoke.
