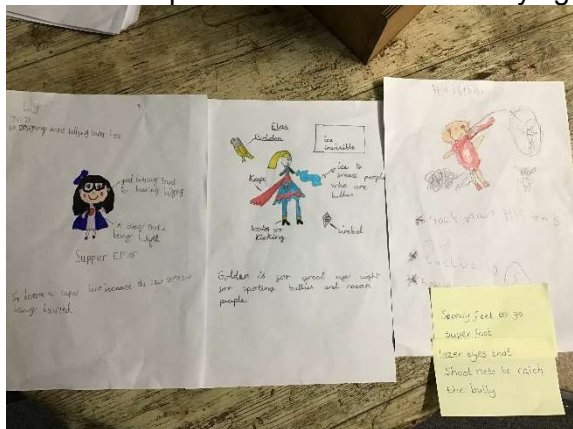




Emerald News
