We have had a very creative week starting with creating our backgrounds for our Winnie the Witch mini outcome inspired by Korky Paul. The children used blue water colour using different shades of blue to start and then used the other primary colours, red and yellow to create magical shapes using thick and thin lines. They then used a pencil to create dark and light shading on their drawings of Winnie the Witch. They look brilliant!











Also this week the children used clay to create coil cauldrons. It was a challenge as the clay was much harder than the playdough they practised with last week. They persevered and the pots are very impressive. As they finally dried the children painted them but they were not quite dry to bring home so after half term they can come home for you to enjoy.











We have been watching videos and talking about famous icons for our black history focus this month for example Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King. The children seemed to be very interested in the people who made a difference to make life fairer and fought for equality.
