



Class: Ruby & Emerald

Date of project: Terms 3 and 4

**Art:** Malleable/3D – create texture and shape to clay - dragon’s eye. Collage – overlap materials and experiment with colour to make a mosaic and/or montage. Look at the work of Alma Thompson.

**DT:** Investigate simple programming and control in Term 3 and explore food and nutrition in Term 4.

**Computing:** Online Safety and the Impact of Technology – Term 3. Data Handling – Term 4.

**History:** Local history study – find out about Arnold Perrett Brewery and links to light. Historical knowledge of trade routes.

**Geography:** Locational knowledge – name and locate European countries – linked to fruit. To know where food comes from linked to trade routes.

**Music:** Listening and appraising – compare moods in music.

**RE:** Believing – What do different people believe about God? Living – What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain?

**PSHE:** Dreams and Goals (Term 3) and Healthy Me (Term 4).

**PE:** Games and Dance (Term 3), Games and Gymnastics (Term 4)

**Science:** Explore light – where light is reflected from and patterns and sizes in shadows – link with DT light. Investigate the lifecycle of plants and explore the requirements of plants for life and growth.

**MFL:** Learn colours and numbers (Term 3) and fruits/vegetables (Term 4).

**Maths:** Discovering equivalence/Reasoning with fractions, solving number problems and investigating statistics.

**English:** Story set in imaginary world, character/setting description, information leaflet and letter writing.

## Where will it take us?



Significant text:

In Term 3 and 4, we will be using the following texts:

**The Snow Dragon** by Vivian French

**The Boy Who Grew Dragons** by Andy Shepherd.

To immerse our class through terms 3 and 4 we will have the following learning environments:

A cold area linked to the Snow Dragon and an opposite hot dragon area with a volcano. There will be ceiling drapes. This environment will include accessories such as cushions, chairs, rug, plants and shelving.
