Jet Class

- Please let us know if someone different will be collecting your child.

Independence

- Children need to be responsible for their own belongings: book bag, reading books, homework, and glasses!
- We will open the doors to school at 8.55, the children will need to self register and will either have editing to complete or handwriting to practice.
- We would like the children to place their book bags into the wooden box if they need their book to be changed or into the coloured house box if they would like it for another night.
- Please let your child know if there is a letter/note in their book bag which needs to be handed in and for them to do that job.

Curriculum

- Our learning is cross-curricular and we take into account the interests and needs of the children. We aim to make it as creative and inspiring as possible.
- Our project question is 'Will your senses come alive? Where we will be learning all about jungle animals, endangered animals and India.
- Children will be learning skills at the appropriate level. When learnt and used confidently, these will be monitored and assessed in all subjects.
- Non negotiables are expected in their learning. These are important to support children's understanding of expectations.
- WAGOLL, peer critique, purple learners, diamond powers and Elli are used daily in our classroom.

English

- We carefully link our English into our mini outcomes and projects to create a more immersive learning environment and to give the children a purpose to their learning. There will often be a hook for their writing (a reason for doing it!)
- Children will regularly review, edit and set learning targets to focus on how to improve as readers and writers.

How you can help:

- Please encourage your child to read at least 5 times a
 week and discuss the contents of his/her reading material
 with them.
- (You can use the questions provided on the reading sheet)
- Please ensure spellings are learnt. New spellings will be sent home weekly to learn for the following week.
- We will regularly issue books on bug club and will let you know via our class newsletter if one has been issued, please ensure your child has had the opportunity to read them.

Maths

- We carefully link our Maths into our mini outcomes and projects to create a more immersive learning environment and to give the children a purpose to their learning. We try to use real life maths problems for the children to solve.
- Maths includes mental arithmetic, practical challenges and a range of activities to support the children with the next steps in their learning.

How you can help:

- Carry out practical activities involving measurement, money, shape and telling the time with analogue and digital clocks.
- Encourage and help your children to learn their number bonds and counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's.
- Completing set activities on Mathletics.
