Uniform reminder **On non-PE days, children are expected to wear full school uniform **



•Grey or black skirts, trousers or shorts in school uniform style

- White polo shirts (with or without school logo)
- Royal blue school sweatshirts (not PE hoodie) or cardigans with the school logo.
- Black, grey or white socks or tights
- Black leather-style shoes or ankle boots, which are sensible and durable. Knee high boots, Uggstyle boot, shoes with heels and trainers are not acceptable.
- Hair that is longer than shoulder length must be tied back with a plain blue or black band.
 A watch to tell the time (not smart watches) and 1 plain stud earring in each ear are the only jewellery permitted.
 - •Nail varnish is not to be worn.
