What have we been learning?

We have had a great first week back after the holidays. The role play has turned into a pirate ship to link in with our class text 'The Troll' by Julia Donaldson and we have been busy creating pirate maps and writing messages in a bottle. In English we have been writing Riddles about the different animals in the Troll story, applying our adjectives s and using a question mark. In maths we have been consolidating missing number subtraction number sentences using numicon and number tracks.

We had our first music singing session with Sue, the children loved it and we sang two songs about sea creatures. We can't wait for our next session next week.





In art we have started our leaning for our next mini outcome 'What is the colour of the sea?' We will be creating our own Van Gogh inspired 'seascape' paintings using different textures. This week we explored primary and secondary colours using a colour sea snail wheels.
