

Uniform reminder

Please make sure that footwear is appropriate (including sports trainers on PE days) and socks are plain and only in school colours.

Nail varnish and jewellery (other than one plain stud in each ear and a simple watch) are not allowed.

Scarlet Fever outbreak

We have now had 3 confirmed cases of Scarlet Fever in the infants within 10 days of each other – this constitutes an outbreak. Please familiarise yourself with the symptoms below.

If you feel your child is displaying ANY of the symptoms please contact your GP as soon as possible and let school know.

The symptoms of scarlet fever can be non-specific in early illness and may include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. Within 48 hours a rash develops, typically on chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, giving the skin a sand paper like texture. Children typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'.

Scarlet fever is highly contagious and if not treated with antibiotics can be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks.

Safe scooting and cycling to school

Parent Council raised a concern that some children are riding bikes and scooters with no helmets. We would strongly encourage children to wear a helmet when riding scooters or bikes. Please also talk to your children about how to keep safe when riding.

We are in the process of booking scooter training for Year 3 and pedestrian training for Year 5 for the summer term.

Sports funding

Swift Sports have been running sessions for the past few years and we have gained from the service provided, however we are now looking into alternative ways to use our sports premium to have the maximum impact on pupils' development. We have asked Swift to continue to run a ks1 and ks2 club and to help out on key events (eg sports day and shuffle up days enrichment – usually fencing and archery – for Y6 students), so these will continue after half term.

We are currently in talks with Forest Green Rovers to look at lunchtime and after school clubs and activities, as well as ks2 interventions - with a football focus - during one afternoon a week. Once the final details are in place, we will let parents know. We are intending for this to start after half term.
