What have we been learning?

We loved our WOW morning with the Shanty men, they taught us lots of sea shanty songs with fun actions and props. We made flags to decorate our classroom using our initials.











In English we read our new class text 'The Singing Mermaid' by Julia Donaldson and discussed whether we thought it was a good idea for the mermaid to join the circus. We then wrote simple sentences to explain our decision and gave reasons why. We thought carefully about using our capital letters, full stops and phonic sounds to segment words we wanted to spell.

In maths we developed our understanding of numbers to 10, using a variety of mathematical resources to represent a given number. Our number of the week was number 8!

In DT we are making moving sea creature pictures, this week we explored and developed different techniques and skills for making levers and sliders using card, scissors, hole punches and split pins.

In English we will be writing descriptions of 'The Singing mermaid' using adjectives.

In maths we will be moving on to comparing and ordering number 1-10 using the greater than, less than and equal signs (<>=)

In science we will be classifying and sorting sea creatures.

In DT we will start to design our own moving sea creature pictures.
