In science they have been investigating blubber and how it keeps polar animals warm in their cold habitats so they can survive.



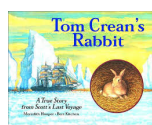
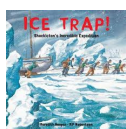
We have been lucky enough to have four students from KLB come into our class to teach us pastel chalk skills ready to create our mini outcome Northern Light pictures.
