To immerse our learning we will have green and blue drapes and field backdrops to create the countryside landscape surrounding Wickwar. We will have a greenhouse in the classroom to represent the allotments in Wickwar. We will include some of Wickwar's most prominent landmarks such as the church, the Electric Oak, Wickwar Coffee Shop and local farms.
