#### Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! The children have returned to school with great attitudes and we are proud of how well they have embraced the start of term.

Thank you very much for all the cards, thank yous and gifts that our wonderful staff received at the end of the term. They were very touched by the kind words. Mrs Windmill sent a special message – see below.

We welcome our new children in Y1 and Y3 and our new Reception children. We cannot wait to see the new Topaz children in school next week and get to know them and their families. Our new staff have also now started – Mr Feaster (Deputy Headteacher) has joined our school and will be teaching Y1, Y4 and Y5 each week; Mrs Cooke has joined Y5 and Miss Maddocks has joined Y1.

### **Infant Reading Books**

We completed an audit of our Infant Reading books from the Unlocking Letters and Sounds and noticed that 87 books are missing, which would cost £435 to replace. If you have a child in Y1-3, please could you have a little look at home to see if you have any there and bring any that you find into school by Weds 10<sup>th</sup> September. Thank you, Miss Clark (English Lead)

#### **Snacks and drinks**

- Children must only bring water (no squash, please) to school in their water bottles. They will have access to their water bottles throughout the day. Please make sure all bottles are clearly named. The children should take them home for cleaning at the end of each day.
- Parents can purchase slices of toast through Scopay for the term. These need to be paid for in advance by the start of each new term. This terms toast booking is now closed, Mrs Price will send an email when next term's is open. Children may bring a piece of fruit for snack instead if they wish. They should not bring other wrapped items for break times.
- We are a nut free school. We have noticed the majority of 'chocolate spreads' now contain nut ingredients, with this in mind we ask that you do not include chocolate spreads in packed lunches to help protect our children who have nut allergies.



We are very proud of the excellent behaviour we see around school and we are proud to launch our new certificate for children who consistently show the 3 Bees (our school rules) in action each week.




How are children rewarded for excellent behaviour and effort?

# Applications for Year 7 2026 for Year 6 Children

#### Deadline 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025

From 8 September 2025, if you live in South Gloucestershire, you will be able to apply for a place online at <a href="https://www.southglos.gov.uk/admissions">www.southglos.gov.uk/admissions</a>. The online application system is secure and simple to use.

Once you have completed and submitted an on-line application form you will receive an email to confirm that your application has been received. Amendments can be made to your online application up to the closing date of but it is very important to remember to re-submit your application each time you access the form even if you do not make changes.

# Applications for School Uniform Reimbursement Grants are still open until 14th September!

The Compass Early Help Team are offering help towards the cost of essential school clothing, such as PE kits, shoes and coats, through the School Uniform Reimbursement Grant.

You can claim up to £50 spent on items for a primary school child and up to £80 for secondary, for a maximum of 3 children per household. Items must be purchased between 1 July to 14 September 2025. You cannot claim for stationery, bags, lunch boxes, or other non-clothing items.

The grant is available if all of these apply:

- you live in South Gloucestershire
- are struggling to pay bills or meet your monthly outgoings
- · have no other means of support through family, friends or donations

### How to apply

Yate One Stop Shop

Bring along the shop receipts showing the item(s) bought and your bank statement (unless you paid in cash). You will be asked to fill in a financial statement of your income and outgoings. Please make sure you have this information to hand. The final date to make a claim is 15 September.

You can also apply by calling us on <u>01454 868009</u>. If your claim is successful, you will be repaid the approved amount in the form of a voucher you can use at a supermarket of your choice.
