School Games Mark - GOLD award

We are very excited to have been awarded the gold School Games Award, which is a massive achievement. It is a testament to the sporting opportunities we provide as a school and from which our children benefit. It is what we have been working towards all year, so that our Year of Sport and its impact is recognised externally too.

Ready, Steady, Go!

This award also adds to our Healthy School bronze award achieved in March 2017, demonstrating our commitment and strengths in promoting fit and healthy lifestyles. Although we completed the application together, a special thank you must go to Miss Pursey for working so hard throughout the year to make this all possible.

Sports Day

The weather was kind to us and the children all participated well. There was a positive atmosphere and it was good to see so many of you there supporting your children and their team. Thank you for all your support. Also thanks to Sarah Spencer and Simon Burton for their commentary and to all the staff for their part in making it such a successful occasion. Special thanks must go to Mrs McAleese who marked the lines but also organised the day with the help of Miss Pursey, Mrs Gee and other TAs, as well as to the sports leaders from KLB who were all past pupils of Alexander Hosea.

District sports

The school once again participated in this annual athletics event at KLB and all the children did exceptionally well, often being placed in the top 4.

Fun run and breakfast

This was an amazing event; the children enjoyed the breakfast and the chance to run for fun. A special thanks to the Friends for organising and running the event.

KS1 Multi-skills

Two teams of KS1 children were entered into the multi-skills event in the Festival of Youth Sport on 10th June. They used the multi-skills they had been taught by the sports coaches this term and one team was placed first. They received a plate in recognition of their achievement. Well done to all the children who took part – their team skills were excellent.

Bristol Together Football tournament

The children who took part in the Bristol Together football competition (which promotes inclusion as the team comprises boys and girls from two very different schools), also had success – they won a silver plate.

Intra-school sporting events

These continue to be held termly and successes celebrated with the awarding of certificates in a sporting assembly, including one for best sporting class and most improved. This is inclusive as it means that children who are not particularly sporty get a chance to succeed and find new talents.

Skipping

The children all benefited from a skipping workshop and provided a display to the rest of the school (and the Parent Council members) at the end of the day by way of a grand finale. Some of them had developed

amazing skills, which they are continuing to use and develop further at play times. We have used the Sports Premium to purchase a school set of the skipping ropes so that children continue to get an opportunity to keep fit and improve their skills.

Circus skills

This Tuesday, all the children will have the opportunity to learn some circus skills as we have a specialist visiting the school to share their expertise.

Swimming

Most of the older children have now managed to swim their 25 metres – and this is the focus for the school, so that we can meet National Curriculum requirements.

Gymnastics

Our gymnasts continue to do well and Lola is currently being trained by international coaches.

PE kit for sporting events

Our new PE kit for sporting events is now in school and ready for use. If your child wears this to an event, please can you make sure that you wash and dry it and return to school as soon as possible afterwards. We will make a note of who borrows the kit and when it is returned as it is a big investment and needs to last a long time!

Table tennis

If you were around on sports day you will have noticed that we took delivery of a new outdoor table tennis table, again funded from our Sports Premium funding. The children are very excited about this and are already using it to play table tennis and invent their own games using other balls. Thank you to the parents who helped with its delivery and siting.

Morfa Bay residential

Writing

Part of what I and the Senior Leadership Team do (Mrs Moncrieff and Mrs Windmill) is monitor and evaluate standards across the curriculum and the school. Having recently had another look at the children's books and also looked at books of children at other local schools, the standard of writing at Alexander Hosea is generally very high. Local Authority moderators have met with teachers earlier in the year to help secure our assessments and they undertook external moderation of writing in Year 6 as part of the statutory process. They were impressed with the children's writing and agreed with our judgements too. Thank you to Mrs Brooks and Mrs Shrewsbury for all the hard work which went into achieving this success.

INSET day - 10th July

We use this day for the in-school transition process, which helps ensure your child has a smooth transition into their next class. As part of it, relevant staff discuss individual children and their needs. Data outcomes are shared, as well as the children's next steps. This information is used to inform planning for next term.

POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION

Friends have allocated money to improve the outdoor learning environment for the children across the school. They have

- paid for wet weather waterproof clothes for EYFS children for use in inclement weather
