Health reminder

If your child is in year 6 and was born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013 (inclusive), they must attend a secondary school in September 2024 unless you decide to educate your child at home. This is a very important decision and you are strongly advised to read the <u>South Gloucestershire Secondary school admissions guide</u> before making any decisions and completing your application. Times Tables Rock Stars

All children in Years 2-6 have a log in for TTRS to help them to practice their times tables. The national expectation is that all Year 4 children have rapid recall (about 6 seconds) of all the tables to 12x12. Like many schools that use TTRS, we find that children who use the programme and practice their tables regularly secure this understanding rapidly. This knowledge really helps them with their fluency and arithmetic as well as reasoning and problem-solving as they progress through Y2 and KS2 (and beyond).

In celebration assembly, we congratulate children who have made great progress in TTRS (eg quickest times, most improved etc).

When the children access TTRS, there are five levels to increase challenge for the pupils as they develop their knowledge and recall.

Jamming – children can practise their choice of times table without being timed.

Gig – a Gig can be completed once a month to assess progress over time.

Garage – questions in this mode are targeted based on previous accuracy and will help children to secure specific facts.

Studio – children will be asked questions from all times tables up to 12×12 including division facts. This is timed and generates a Studio Speed and Rock Status.

Soundcheck – this is similar to the official multiplication check where children are asked 25 questions with 6-seconds given to answer each one.
