This project will focus on our oceans: where they are located, what is found in them and the damage that is being caused due to plastic pollution. After learning all about our oceans and the impact of plastic pollution, children will put together an exhibition to persuade others to help protect our oceans. They will create persuasive and informative leaflets; program a Scratch project; use a range of art skills to produce emotive posters and combine art and DT skills to build 3D recycled plastics marine sculptures.

Maths – multiplication and division; fractions, decimals and percentages.

Science – properties of materials.

Geography – locating the world’s seas and oceans, water cycle and natural resources.

History – Titanic mini project; Romans – why was water important?
