## Uniform Policy – March 2023

### RATIONALE

- 1. The school feels having a school uniform is the preferred option in line with Department for Education recommendations.
- 2. School uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the school's ethos, identity and pride. It also promotes good behaviour and good relationships between pupils and protects children from social pressures.
- 3. A school uniform supports effective teaching and learning.
- 4. The type of uniform chosen needs to have a unique identity and be:-
  - easy to wear
  - liked by pupils and parents/carers
  - hard wearing
  - smart yet affordable
- 5. It needs to take into consideration any requests for variation in uniform based on religious, cultural or social grounds and to have a flexible approach to pupils with individual special needs. Any changes would need individual consideration by the Head teacher.

#### UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

There is an expectation that children come to school dressed smartly. Fashion items are not considered appropriate. The uniform list is on the next page.


We have a unisex approach, so children are able to wear the items they feel comfortable in from the options in this policy.


## ALL CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT NEEDS TO BE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME

All pupils are expected to adhere to this policy. KS2 pupils and parents are jointly considered responsible for breaches of this policy. In the case of younger pupils (FS/KS1), parents / carers will be contacted.

The uniform requirements and jewellery permitted will be publicised on the school website. Reminders will be provided in newsletters.

A lost property box is kept in the main entrance. Any items not re-claimed by the end of each term will be disposed of.





## **OTHER ITEMS OF UNIFORM**

- **Fleeces** School fleeces are available. These are for wearing as a coat and so are for outdoor use only.
- In the summer, children may wear a sun hat, when outside. This can be the school cap with logo.
- **Wellington boots** these are required by all Reception children for outdoor learning and play

## WHERE TO PURCHASE UNIFORM

A limited number of House T-shirts are also available from the school office, whilst stocks last.

Book bags printed with the school logo are currently provided by the Friends of Alexander Hosea Primary School when a child starts school. Replacement bags can be purchased by parents from the school office.

## JEWELLERY AND ACCESSORIES

Watches and small, plain stud earrings are the only jewellery permitted. Watches must be removed for PE lessons and it is recommended that earrings should not be worn to school on PE days. If your child is wearing stud earrings, they will need to be able to remove these themselves or tape should be provided from home if they are newly pierced.

The school accepts no responsibility for any jewellery and personal belongings lost at school.

NB Smart watches are not permitted for safeguarding reasons.

#### **Hair bands**

These must be plain and in the school colours (blue or black).

**Nail varnish** is not to be worn to school.

#### No mobile phones to be in school.

**Bags** - If children bring a bag to school in which to carry personal belongings, parents should ensure this is not too big as there is restricted space on coat pegs. Lunchboxes are placed straight onto the class trolley in the mornings, so a bag is not needed to carry these.

#### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WITH UNIFORM

Families in receipt of Free School Meals can ask for uniform items (including a swim suit for swimming lessons) to be purchased from their child's Pupil Premium. This can include up to  $\pounds 20$  towards new shoes/trainers or a school coat.

The Friends of AHS second hand uniform system can also be helpful to keep costs down. Donations of clean, unwanted, good condition uniform items are gratefully received and can be placed in the donation basket in the school lobby door. Parents are encouraged to remove the name label of the donating family from uniform items, before handing in.
