The two main alternative traditional tales texts will be reading will be 'The three little wolves and the Big Bad Pig' by Eugene Trivizas and 'Little Red' by David Roberts. We will be also be reading other alternative traditional tales during whole class reading. In science, we will be using the text 'Roots, Stems, Leaves and Flowers' by Ruth Owen, 'A Little Guide to Wild Flowers' by Charlotte Voake, 'and 'The Things That I LOVE about TREES' by Chris Butterworth. In History, we will use the test 'The Queen' by Richard Brassey to support our learning about significant famous people.

Our project will immerse us into the world of traditional tales building on our knowledge from Topaz class. We will explore a variety of traditional tales with a twist, which will allow us to build on our story language skills. We will kick start our project with our WOW dress up day and picnic in the woods.

In Term 5 our History focus will be to compare two significant individuals. We will be researching and comparing the reigns of Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II.

In Science we will be planting our own flowers to help us understand that plants need water and sunlight in order to grow.

Our Art will be linked to houses from traditional tales, we will design and make our own clay tile houses based on our favourite fairytales and characters.

In Term 6 we will make local links with the WEAG and go for a walk to their orchard and allotments, We will invite them into school to talk about the work they do and how we can help. This will link into our global link, understanding deforestation and learning about World Environment Day.
