In Term 1, our main text will be 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey; we will also be using the fiction book Man on the Moon by Simon Bartram. We will be researching space by exploring a range of nonfiction texts and imagining life in space.



In Term 2, our class text will be 'Lost in the Toy Museum' by David Lucas, we will also be using 'The History of Toys' by Helen Cox Cannons, 'Toys in the past' by Joanna Brundle and 'What was it like in the past: toys' by Kamini Kahanduri to support our learning in history.

Our journey will start with a WOW day where the children will take part in a toy hunt searching for the lost toys in our class text 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey which we will learn to orally retell with actions. In science we will be investigating a range of materials and carry out exciting experiments testing materials. In Art, we will be inspired by the artist Peter Thorpe to create our own prints

In Term 4 we are hoping to use the Yate Heritage Museum resources which will lead us into our class text 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. We will use this text to support our local links and develop our historical understanding of how things have changed within living memory. We are hoping to invite older members of the community into the class to share their memories of their favourite toys when they were children. We will create our own toy puppet in DT and write labels to help the lost toys find their way home.
