In **English** we have been writing our own versions of Little Red changing the character and what they pack in their basket to our own ideas. The children have worked hard on this tricky piece of learning. Our window bag beans had started to grow stalks over the long weekend so it was time to plant them into pots. We spent some time in the garden and Mrs Dyer helped everyone to plant their bean into a pot. Our pots are now safely back into the classroom for us to continue to keep watch! In our **Science** lesson this week we have been learning about the parts of trees and the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees. In **DT** we have been learning about 4 different attaching techniques that we may need when we build our chairs for baby bear. In our colour houses we moved around the classroom to have a go at the joins; flange, I-brace, slot and tab before reviewing how easy or difficult we found each one as a class.
