


Ruby Class Newsletter

This week in Ruby class we have done lots of different things that will go towards our first mini outcome "What's in the eye?"

On Monday, we explored the dangers of the sun and created our own posters on how to protect ourselves from the sun and why it can be dangerous.







In art this week we joined Emerald class to discover what our mini outcome would be! We are going to create a dragon eye that lights up using a circuit. The scales will be formed using clay. So, the children got to design their own dragon eye as well as experiment using different techniques with the clay!







In maths, we have been learning about money, and how to add and subtract pounds and pence, the children were also learning how to read questions carefully to ensure they were doing the right calculations. In English this week we have been creating our own version of the dragon or Little Tuft, and adding inverted commas for speaking parts in the story. In guided reading, I have asked the children to read extracts from different well known stories to use their inference skills to answer questions about the text. This week in PE we implemented different styles of jumping and travelling to create a new dance routine. The children used

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the beat of the music to ensure their dance routine went in time with the music. We also had another dance off, and I chose a new Dancer of the Day!
