Term 3, week 2:

Here we are again. Christmas is over and the children are back with a bang, enjoying 2026! It is wonderful to see them come back with such enthusiasm. As you know, our project is focused on 'toys'. We kick-started the project with a lovely Wow day. The children loved sharing and it was wonderful to see the range of toys that interested the children.

In **English**, we have been reading the story of Lubna and her pebble. It's a sweet story about a little girl who is a refugee. She lands in her new homeland with nothing and so she finds a pebble on the beach and makes it her toy. From this, the children have written some lovely character descriptions. In **Maths**, we have been reading and writing numbers to 20 indifferent ways, including words and them comparing numbers to 20. I was so proud to see how well the children problem-solved this. It shows how much progress they have made! In **Geography**, we have been looking at the UK. The children have started to learn which countries make up the UK as well as which seas and oceans surround it. In **Science**, we are learning about everyday material. The children went on a material hunt to identify objects and what they are made from.

Phonics Introduced this term: all of 5a – please practise with your children as its important for them to retain this information.
