Ruby Class Newsletter

Another nonstop week for Ruby class this week. In English, we recapped the use of subordinating conjunctions to make complex sentences. Some children were able to challenge themselves and add relative clauses to their sentences to add extra information! The children then applied this learning and wrote a letter home as if they were the Stone Age boy.

In PE, we carried on with our athletics - this time the children created their own game with a points system. We are hoping to do Sports Day next term - so keep an eye out for that!

In science, the children carried out yet another experiment! I didn't think anything would be as good or as exciting as the shoe grip experiment. But this week the children looked at magnetic force and measured the distance it took for some metal objects to be picked up by a magnet. At the end of the lesson, the children all had a go at making a paper clip float in mid-air!



In maths last week, we recapped 2D shapes, this week we developed our understanding in geometry and discovered 3D shapes. The children were all able to identify the names of these shapes as well as describe their properties.

After designing our printing blocks last week in art, this week the children scored their design onto a polystyrene block, rolled out ink and printed it into their books - they all turned out amazing!
