What a very busy week we have had in Ruby Class this week!

In maths, we have been learning to read and write numbers in numerals and words up to 1000! The children have then used their skills to compare two numbers to see which is greater and which is less. They have also practised how to order them from largest to smallest and vice

versa.







It's been a week of grammar in English this week. We have recapped apostrophes for possession and learnt about the present perfect tense. We have then written a recount on one of the chapters from George's Marvellous Medicine to apply our new skills.







In science, we have explored different types of skeletons, the endoskeleton, exoskeleton and hydrostatic skeleton. In geography, the children have recapped on their knowledge of human and physical features locating them on maps and aerial photos. In PSHE, we explored what a nightmare school might be like! In music, we had great fun with a lady from the music hub who came to teach the children sing! In French, the children have started to learn how to express how they feel. In PE, we have started our country dancing and games. In computing, we have been learning how to use and format tools and effects on 'Word'.
