So, here we are (at the end of week 6) and the children are definitely feeling the tiredness from a long term. It's hard to believe that there is still another two weeks to go! Despite the tiredness, the children are absolutely amazing and I am so proud of the progress we have already made, adjusting to the busy year 1 life.

In **English** we have been working on their transcription skills which holds a process of 'holding', planning, writing and revising a sentence. Though this seems like a slow and simple process, it allows the children to understand and engrain the structure of a sentence (using subject nouns, verbs and object nouns). I support their understanding using colour semantics. If you would like to know more about this, please do not hesitate to contact me.

In **Maths** we have been learning more about the add and equals symbol, adding numbers with 10. Today, the children will be reasoning and problem-solving with the supply teacher.

In **Science**, we have started learning about human animals, identifying basic body parts including 4 organs (heart, brain, stomach and lungs). In **Geography**, we have started to compare cities, towns and villages, starting with Wickwar. The children have been applying their knowledge of human and physical geographical features to identify places within Wickwar. We compared these on maps and aerial photos.
