

Ruby Class Newsletter

Another busy week in Ruby class! In maths, the children carried on with their multiplication skills and realised they could solve all multiples of 10 by a single digit! They have transferred their knowledge of multiplication and started to look at division facts.

In English the children used prepositional language to describe a "fight" scene from a chapter in our book. They also looked at commas in a list to help describe what a dragon fruit looks like.

In Science this week, the children have created beautiful life cycles of a flowering plant, knowing the 5 stages in the life cycle and discussing that once the seeds are dispersed, the cycle starts again.

In PE, the children reflected on their symmetrical shapes from last week and were able to show off some more technical shapes through handstands, cartwheels and forward rolls.



In geography, the children used their atlas and compass skills to identify which European country I was asking them to find. They were really excited to discuss all their facts about the countries we came across.

This term in Jigsaw, we are looking at Healthy Me - which involves talking about having a healthy balance. We discussed how calories are used to give us energy, which helps us when we need to exercised. They also ordered some well-known snacks in order of most to least sugar.
