The school has purchased a new PHSE (Personal, Health, Social and Emotional) scheme that we are introducing through the school. Each class has a jigsaw character and in Topaz ours in called Jaz. All children throughout the school will engage in an hour of PHSE from this each week which gives some calming time with breathing exercises and some time to think about how we feel about

things. Our focus this week has been kind hands. We also joined the school for assembly to share in the whole school Jigsaw assembly.

The children have been very interested in watching the birds from our classroom but this week there has been a problem with the squirrel. It has taken the fat-balls from the feeder so this provoked a conversation about sharing which was very useful. The children have also been painting woodland creatures and we have opened an animal rescue role-play area.
