


Topaz News

In our forest session this week we looked at catkins and pussy willow. We have been using pastels to make observational drawings of daffodils in the classroom. We looked carefully at the stem, petals and trumpet.



We also had a fire in the forest this week and made toast which we liked a lot and we hope the birds enjoyed the toast we made for them too!

Our final goal for reading in the new Early Years curriculum has now been split into a decoding goal and a separate comprehension goal. I am pleased about this as it highlights the importance of being able to talk about stories as well as decode words.
